PETC will review submitted proposals in October and notify presenters of their status no later than January 2010. New instructors may be asked to submit additional material and/or references, and may be required to attend presentation training events (online or classroom).

Course Difficulty Levels

Basic

A basic course covers introductory concepts, terms and nomenclature about the topic. Students need little or no prior knowledge or hands-on/application experience with the topic. Students with intermediate knowledge of this topic may find the content useful as a refresher. The course is a stepping stone to intermediate level.

Intermediate

Students should have one or more years of hands-on/application experience with the topic. Students who have some advanced experience may find the content useful as a refresher. Students should have a solid working knowledge and vocabulary of this topic.

Advanced

Students should have two or more years of hands-on/application experience with the topic. Students should have a comprehensive grasp of theory and concepts about this topic. Students should have already completed significant other training in this topic. Students should actively be working in area or have previously taken the intermediate courses in the topic.
