2. Determine your eligibility. Eligibility for taking the CTS-I exam includes verification of experience in six AV installation skill areas: rack building, audio setup, projector set-up and installation, rack mounting, and customer relations.

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3. Self assess. It is critical that you self-assess. Carefully review the content outline in the , as well as the , paying attention to topic areas and their percentage of the exam, and the number of questions on the exam in each area.

4. Apply. Submit your to the Certification Office by fax, mail, or email.
